A message from the Executive Director

Lincolnway Special Recreation Association (LWSRA) continues to thrive and be an innovative force in the Lincolnway community. The agency has rebounded from the pandemic and our financial position continues to be stable. Events like our Day with the Grinch & our holiday activity kits greatly assisted in maintaining a healthy fund balance during a period of financial uncertainty.

The 2021-2022 season brought many positive changes to how we offered programs. Our talented staff continued to create and adapt virtual and in-person programs so that participants of all abilities can enjoy recreation.

This year we served 358 unique participants. We also offered over 300 programs including athletic opportunities for those with intellectual and physical disabilities, social programs, special events and outings, dances, private music lessons, and clinics. LWSRA is also committed to ensuring that program cost is not a barrier to participation. In 2021-2022, we offered 48 families financial assistance totaling \$8,900.

Lincolnway Special Recreation Foundation has been a major contributor to our Financial Assistance Program and overall financial success. Their donation to the agency helps with funding toward vehicles, uniforms, programs, and state and national tournaments.

Each year we redefine and grow our vision of success. Due to the passion and dedication of our staff, our program quality continues to rise. For example, our unified volleyball team went undefeated the past two years due to participant talent and determination in addition to strong coaching. We have also introduced a new intake procedure for our programs and have implemented a new early childhood program. I am happy to report on our success this year and look forward to what is to come.








FY 2020-2021 TOTAL NET POSITION \$3,994,630
