Read along to the book, *Included*, written by Megan Prendergast. Each of the story posts features visuals and video/audio narration from LWSRA participants.














PARTICIPATION

The growth at LWSRA soared to new heights in FY 23-24. We welcomed **484 individuals** who participated in **5,725 program sessions**, marking a 20% increase from the year before. This growth is a testament to the unwavering dedication and passion of our participants, staff, and community supporters.




BY DISTRICT







Total Expenditures: \$2,273,023




